	April 1945	Arrest by US troops at Villa Hügel
	1947 – 1948	Trial before an American military court in Nuremberg; sentenced to twelve years imprisonment as well as confiscation of all assets
	1951	Pardoned by the US High Commissioner for Germany, John Jay McCloy, and restitution of assets
	March 1953	Assumption of the management of the Fried. Krupp company, from November onwards with his personal chief representative, Berthold Beitz
	April 1967	Public announcement of the establishment of the non-profit Alfried Krupp von Bohlen und Halbach Foundation
July 30, 1967	Death of Alfried Krupp von Bohlen und Halbach
